21	PARTIES
22	1. Wood Robinson ('Complainant') brings this Accusation solely in his official capacity
23	as the Enforcement Supervisor I of the Contractors' State License Board ("Board"), Department
24	of Consumer Affairs.
25	2. On or about August 12, 1996, the Registrar of Contractors ("Registrar") issued
26	Contractor's License Number 726110, classification C-16 [fire protection contractor] to
27	American Fire Services Inc., doing business as American Fire Protection ("American Fire"),
28	with Danny Victor Williams as the Responsible Managing Officer ("RMO") and Scott Mendlola

as an Officer, ("Respondent"). On or about November 29, 2004, Pamela Diane Williams was removed as an Officer. The Contractor's License was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought herein.

On or about July 16, 2009, in the case titled People vs. Danny Williams, the Superior 3. 4 Court of Tulare County, Case No. VCF 222476, Respondent's Contractor License No. 726110 5 was suspended pursuant to Penal Code section 23 and/or Business and Professions Code section 6 7106, while the criminal matter was pending before the court. Subsequently, in obedience to the 7 court's order, on or about July 20, 2009, the Registrar issued the Order of the Registrar 8 suspending Respondent's Contractor License No. 726110. These suspensions remain in effect. 9 4. On or about April 15, 2010, Contractor License No. 726110 was suspended pursuant 10 to California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 996.340. On or about August 31, 2010, the 11 license expired under suspensions. On or about October 14, 2010, the license was renewed 12 inactive and the section 996.340 suspension was lifted. 13

JURISDICTION

15 5. This Accusation is brought before the Registrar for the Board under the authority of
16 the following laws. All section references are to the Business and Professions Code ("Code")
17 unless otherwise indicated.

6. Section 7090 of the Code provides, in pertinent part, that the Registrar may suspend
or revoke any license or registration if the licensee or registrant is guilty of or commits any one or
more of the acts or omissions constituting cause for disciplinary action.

7. Section 7076.5 of the Code provides, in pertinent part, that the inactive status of a
license shall not bar any disciplinary action for violating provisions of the Contractors' State
License Law (Bus. & Prof. Code, § 7000, et seq.).

8. Section 7095 of the Code states:

The decision [of the Registrar] may:

(a) Provide for the immediate complete suspension by the licensee of all operations as a contractor during the period fixed by the decision.

(b) Permit the licensee to complete any or all contracts shown by competent evidence taken at the hearing to be then uncompleted.

(c) Impose upon the licensee compliance with such specific conditions as may be just in connection with its operations as a contractor disclosed at the hearing, and may further provide that until such conditions are complied with, no application for restoration of the suspended or revoked license shall be accepted by the Registrar.

9. Section 7096 of the Code states:

For the purpose of this chapter, the term "licensee" shall include an individual, partnership, corporation, limited liability company, joint venture, or any combination or organization licensed under this chapter, and shall also include any named responsible managing officer, responsible managing manager, responsible managing member, or personnel of that licentiate whose appearance has qualified the licentiate under the provisions of Section 7068.

10. Section 7097 of the Code states:

Notwithstanding the provisions of Sections 7121 and 7122, when any license has been suspended by a decision of the Registrar pursuant to an accusation or pursuant to subdivision (b) of Section 7071.17, Section 7085.6 or 7090.1, any additional license issued under this chapter [the Contractors' State License Law] in the name of the licensee or for which the licensee furnished qualifying experience and appearance under the provisions of Section 7068, may be suspended by the registrar without further notice.

11. Section 7098 of the Code states:

Notwithstanding the provisions of Sections 7121 and 7122, when any license has been revoked under the provisions of this chapter [the Contractors' State License Law], any additional license issued under this chapter in the name of the licensee or for which the licensee furnished qualifying experience and appearance under the provisions of Section 7068, may be revoked by the registrar without further notice.

12. Section 7106.5 of the Code provides that the expiration, cancellation, forfeiture, or

suspension of a license by operation of law or by order or decision of the Registrar, or a court of

|| law, or the voluntary surrender of the license shall not deprive the Registrar of jurisdiction to

proceed with any investigation of or action or disciplinary proceeding against the license, or to

22 render a decision suspending or revoking the license. Under Code section 7076.1, the Registrar

may reinstate a cancelled license if the licensee pays all of the fees and meets all of the

qualifications and requirements for obtaining an original license.

13. Section 7121 of the Code states:

A person who has been denied a license for a reason other than failure to document sufficient satisfactory experience for a supplemental classification for an existing license, or who has had his or her license revoked, or whose license is under suspension, or who has failed to renew his or her license while it was under suspension, or who has been a partner, officer, director, manager, or associate of any partnership, corporation, limited liability company, firm, or association whose application for a license has been denied for a reason other than failure to document sufficient satisfactory experience for a supplemental classification for an existing license, or whose license has been revoked, or whose license is under suspension, or who has failed to renew a license while it was under suspension, and while acting as a partner, officer, director, manager, or associate had knowledge of or participated in any of the prohibited acts for which the license was denied, suspended, or revoked, shall be prohibited from serving as an officer, director, associate, partner, manager, qualifying individual, or member of the personnel of record of a licensee, and the employment, election, or association of this type of person by a licensee in any capacity other than as a nonsupervising bona fide employee shall constitute grounds for disciplinary action.

14. Section 7121.5 of the Code states:

A person who was the qualifying individual on a revoked license, or of a license under suspension, or of a license that was not renewed while it was under suspension, shall be prohibited form serving as an officer, director, associate, partner, manager, or qualifying individual of a licensee, whether or not the individual had knowledge of or participated in the prohibited acts or omissions for which the license was revoked, or suspended, and the employment, election, or association of that person by a licensee shall constitute grounds for disciplinary action.

15. Section 7122 of the Code states:

The performance by an individual, partnership, corporation, limited liability company, firm, or association of an act or omission constituting a cause for disciplinary action, likewise constitutes a cause for disciplinary action against a licensee other than the individual qualifying on behalf of the individual or entity, if the licensee was a partner, officer, director, manager, or associate of that individual, partnership, corporation, limited liability company, firm, or association at the time the act or omission occurred, and had knowledge of or participated in the prohibited act or omission.

Section 7122.5 of the Code states:

The performance by an individual, partnership, corporation, limited liability company, firm, or association of an act or omission constituting a cause for disciplinary action, likewise constitutes a cause for disciplinary action against a licensee who at the time that the act or omission occurred was the qualifying individual of that individual, partnership, corporation, limited liability company, firm, or association, whether or not he or she had knowledge of or participated in the prohibited act or omission.

- 17. section 118, subdivision (b), of the Code provides that the suspension, expiration,
- surrender, or cancellation of a license shall not deprive the CSLB of jurisdiction to proceed with

1	STATUTORY PROVISIONS
2	18. Section 7108 of the Code states:
3	Diversion of funds or property received for prosecution or completion of a specific construction project or operation, or for a specified purpose in the
4	prosecution or completion of any construction project or operation, or failure substantially to account for the application or use of such funds or property on the
5	construction project or operation for which such funds or property were received constitutes a cause for disciplinary action.
6	19. Section 7116 of the Code states:
8	The doing of any wilful or fraudulent act by the licensee as a contractor in consequence of which another is substantially injured constitutes a cause for disciplinary action.
9	20. Section 7123 of the Code states:
10	A conviction of a crime substantially related to the qualifications, functions
11	and duties of a contractor constitutes a cause for disciplinary action. The record of the conviction shall be conclusive evidence thereof.
12 13	21. Section 7124 of the Code states:
14	A verdict of guilty or a conviction following a plea of nolo contendere is deemed to be a conviction within the meaning of this article. The board may order
15 16	the license suspended or revoked, or may decline to issue a license, when the time for appeal has elapsed, or the judgment of conviction has been affirmed on appeal or when an order granting probation is made suspending the imposition of sentence, irrespective of a subsequent order under the provisions of Section 1203.4 of the Penal Code allowing such person to withdraw his plea of guilty and to enter a plea of

19	REGULATORY PROVISION
20	22. California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 832.16, Class C-16, Fire Protection
21	Contractor, states:
22	A Fire protection contractor lays out, fabricates and installs all types of fire
23	protection systems; including all the equipment associated with these systems, excluding electrical alarm systems.
24	COST RECOVERY
25	23. Section 125.3 of the Code provides, in pertinent part, that the Board may request the
26	administrative law judge to direct a licentiate found to have committed a violation or violations of
27	the licensing act to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and
28	enforcement of the case, with failure of the licentiate to comply subjecting the license to not being

renewed or reinstated. If a case settles, then recovery of investigation and enforcement costs may be included in a stipulated settlement.

FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Criminal Convictions)

24. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under Code section 7123, in that on or 5 about February 23, 2011, in the case titled People vs. Danny Victor Williams, Tulare County 6 Superior Court Case No. VCF 222476, Respondent was found guilty of violating Penal Code 7 sections 386, 484b, 487, subdivision (a), and Health and Safety Code, resulting in three felony convictions and numerous misdemeanor convictions for violating an assortment of State Fire Marshal regulations. 10

25. Respondent appealed all of the convictions to the Court of Appeal, Fifth District, 11 which issued its decision on or about August 8, 2013, in People v. Danny Victor Williams (2013) 12 218 Cal.App.4th 1038, affirming the following convictions against Respondent: one count, 13 violation of Penal Code sections 484b [unlawful diversion of construction funds], a felony; one 14 count, violation of Penal Code section 487, subdivision (b) [grand theft of personal property – 15 false pretenses], a felony; 25 counts, violation of Health and Safety Code sections 13195 16 [violation of State Fire Marshal regulations – automatic fire extinguisher systems], 17 misdemeanors; and one count, violation of Health and Safety Code section 13160 [violation of 18 State Fire Marshal regulations - portable fire extinguishers], a misdemeanor.¹ Said crimes are 19 substantially related to the qualifications, functions, and duties of a licensed contractor. 20

The underlying circumstances for the felony convictions are: On or about and 21 a. between June 25, 2008, and November 5, 2008, Respondent entered into a contract with victim 22 SSB for specified repairs to portions of SSB's fire sprinkler system and received money from 23 SSB for the purpose of obtaining or paying for services, labor, materials, and/or equipment for 24 those services. Respondent unlawfully diverted the funds from SSB for uses not related to the 25

26 ¹ There are 25 victims for the Health and Safety Code 13195 convictions and one of them is also a victim for the Health and Safety Code section 13160 conviction. Each Health and Safety 27 Code count names the particular victim and the specific State Fire Marshall regulation(s) violated for that victim. 28

contract in that Respondent did not complete the construction project, did not finish services that had been started, and never started other services under the contract. Respondent's taking of SSB's money and personal property exceeded the value of \$400.00 and demonstrates his intent to defraud the victim in that Respondent represented work had been completed when in fact it was not completed or never started.

The underlying circumstances for the misdemeanor convictions are: On or b. about and between January 18, 2006, and November 25, 2008, Respondent entered into contracts 7 with 25 Tulare County restaurants and small businesses ("victims") to provide services to inspect 8 their hood systems, that is, automatic fire extinguishing systems ("systems") designed to cover 9 kitchen areas and cooking equipment, and/or portable fire extinguishers. Respondent issued 10 inspection tags and hood services reports indicating the systems and portable fire extinguishers 11 were compliant when Respondent knew they were impaired - they were not fully compliant with 12 the fire code and/or needed to be upgraded to meet minimum regulatory standards. 13

SECOND CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Fraud)

Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under Code section 7116 in that on or 26. 16 about and between June 25, 2008, and November 5, 2008, Respondent engaged in willful or 17 fraudulent acts to the substantial injury of victim SSB. The acts are set forth in paragraph 25 and 18 subparagraph "a," above, incorporated herein by reference. 19

THIRD CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Diversion of Construction Funds)

27. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under Code section 7108 in that on or 22 about and between June 25, 2008, and November 5, 2008, Respondent received funds or property 23 for a construction project from victim SSB pursuant to a contract for services, and failed 24 substantially to account for the application or use of those funds or property on the construction 25 project for which the funds or property were received. The underlying circumstances are set forth 26 in paragraph 25 and subparagraph "a," above, incorporated herein by reference. 27

2	WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged,
3	and that following the hearing, the Registrar of Contractors issue a decision:
4	1. Revoking or suspending Contractor's License Number 726110 issued to American
5	Fire Services Inc., doing business as American Fire Protection, Danny Victor Williams,
6	Responsible Managing Officer, and Scott Mendlola Arnold, Officer;
7	2. Prohibiting Danny Victor Williams from serving as an officer, director, associate,
8	partner, or qualifying individual of any licensee during the period that discipline is imposed on
9	Contractor's License No. 726110 issued to American Fire Services Inc., doing business as
10	American Fire Protection, Danny Victor Williams, Responsible Managing Officer, and Scott
11	Mendlola Arnold, Officer;
12	3. Revoking or suspending any other license for which Danny Victor Williams is
13	furnishing the qualifying experience or appearance;
14	4. Ordering restitution of all damages according to proof suffered by Respondent's
15	victims as a condition of probation in the event probation is ordered;
16	5. Ordering restitution of all damages suffered by Respondent's victims as a result of
17	Danny Victor Williams' conduct as a contractor, as a condition of restoration of Contractor's
18	License No. 726110, issued to American Fire Services Inc., doing business as American Fire
19	Protection, Danny Victor Williams, Responsible Managing Officer, and Scott Mendlola Arnold,
20	Officer;
21	6. Ordering American Fire Services Inc., doing business as American Fire Protection,
22	Danny Victor Williams, Responsible Managing Officer, and Scott Mendlola Arnold, Officer, to
23	pay the Registrar of Contractors his costs in the investigation and enforcement of the case
24	according to proof at the hearing, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 125.3;
25	7. Ordering American Fire Services Inc., doing business as American Fire Protection,
26	Danny Victor Williams, Responsible Managing Officer, and Scott Mendlola Arnold, Officer, to
27	provide the Registrar with a listing of all contracting projects in progress and the anticipated
28	completion date of each;
