Governor Appoints Board Members

Governor George Deukmejian appointed the following members to the Contractors State License Board. These appointees fill three of seven public member positions on the board and one reappointment.

STEPHEN H. LAZARIAN, Jr., of San Diego, is an attorney and partner in the law firm of Lazarian, Sivas, Martinez and Vanian. He replaces Wellford Wilms of Santa Monica. Lazarian received his bachelor's degree in economics and business from Westmont College in 1970 and his juris doctorate from California Western School of Law three years later. He is a member of the State Bar of California, the American Bar Association, the San Diego Bar Association and the San Diego Trial Lawyers' Association. His term will expire on June 1, 1989.

ELTON "SKIP" MICHAEL, of Sunland, is a detective with the Los Angeles Police Department. He received his bachelor of science degree in Public Administration from the University of Southern California in 1980 and his MPA from the same university two years later. Elton is a member of the board of directors for the YMCA in Sunland. His term will expire on June 1, 1988.

M. JEAN WESTGARD, of Union City, is a councilwoman. She replaces Carolyn A. Moore of San Francisco. Westgard has been a city council member for five years and was on the planning commission for five and one-half years. Westgard is a board member of the League of California Cities and a member of the State Policy Committee on Public Safety and chairperson of the Police Sub-

Committee. Her term will expire on June 1, 1988.

Reappointed to fill the labor representative vacancy on the board is JOHN LAZARRA of Anaheim. A former chairperson of the board, Lazarra has served since 1978. He is the District Director, Fourth District of the International Brotherhood of Painters and Allied Trades. He is also Vice President of the Painting and Drywall Work Preservation Fund. His term will expire on June 1, 1988.

Members of the board receive \$50 per meeting day and are compensated for necessary travel expenses.

These appointments require Senate confirmation.

ABESTOS CERTIFICATION

New Law Requires Asbestos Certification in 1986

On October 2, 1985, Governor Deukmejian signed into law urgency legislation, AB 2040, by Assemblyman Gray Davis, to regulate the handling of asbestos. The legislation requires that the Contractors State License Board develop a certification examination for licensed contractors by May 15, 1986. Since asbestos can be removed from public school buildings only when the schools are not in session, the May deadline was imposed to ensure that another summer vacation period did not pass without the stricter regulations in place for asbestos handling.

Assemblyman Davis applauded the Governor "for signing legislation defending the health and safety of school children. AB 2040 establishes a first-time air standard for asbestos exposure in California public schools. Over 1,000 public schools will undergo asbestos abatement work during the next three to five years. It is, therefore, morally and legally unjust for us to allow these children to sit in classrooms that may have been contaminated with asbestos fibers. AB 2040 provides the standards and guidelines to protect building occupants from asbestos exposure."

SOLAR FRAUD SCAMS

As some of the solar energy and energy conservation tax credit deadlines near, fraudulent sales tactics to sell solar systems also seem to be on the rise. The CSLB is involved in a number of felony investigations where homeowners have become the victims of deceptive and false sales tactics. The cases involve thousands of dollars worth of solar home improvements where some homeowners used their homes as collateral for loans.

Cases in Southern California caught the attention of television's "Fightback" program host David Horowitz. In a television interview with Horowitz, victims alleged that they were sold solar systems costing approximately, \$11,000 on the premise that the system would cost them only a fraction of the cost because the manufacturer, federal and state governments combined would *rebate* three-fourths of the cost. The homeowners signed the contracts only to discover three weeks later that they were responsible for the entire loan amount, that manufacturers' rebates in this case are nonexistent and governmental tax credits are available only to qualified

households. Many of the victims are retired and on fixed incomes and may not qualify for the tax credits.

Aside from the tax credits, the homeowners are faced with loan payments and the dismal possibility of losing their homes. For the moment, however, the CSLB has prevailed in a legal action against certain contractors and finance companies to prevent foreclosure. The legal action prohibits finance companies from collecting or accepting payments until the next superior court hearing.

So far the CSLB has been investigating four solar companies. The CSLB has taken criminal action against Mission Viejo Solar and is suing Mission Viejo Solar where there could be as many as 100 victims involved. The CSLB has charged Harold Maridon with 22 counts of felony grand theft by false pretenses and using someone else's license for fraudulent purposes. At the request of the CSLB, the Orange County Superior Court issued a restraining order prohibiting lenders from foreclosing on victims' homes. Other civil action is contemplated in other cases.

To The Industry

As licensed contractors, you know that the unlicensed contractor poses a problem for everyone, licensed contractors and the consuming public alike. In part, the public is fooled into thinking that a nonlicensed contractor will give them a better deal because nonlicensees sometimes quote lower prices than licensed contractors. As licensed contractors, you know the consumer is taking a lot of risks and in the long run, often winds up paying more for correcting shoddy or abandoned work.


Historically, the board has attempted to caution consumers about the dangers of contracting with unlicensed contractors and to increase public awareness about consumer rights and responsibilities when contracting by providing consumer oriented literature. This year, however, the board has greatly enhanced its consumer education efforts by introducing a new program, "Operation Outreach" and has taken it directly to the consumer.

Operation Outreach is a series of public seminars where CSLB representatives (staff) explain home improvement laws and consumer protection measures. Operation Outreach has flourished into a series of seminars targeted at senior citizen groups, church organizations, civic and service clubs (i.e., Kiwanis, Rotary, etc.), consumer fairs, student groups and others throughout the state.

Each forum is opened up by informing the participants that state law requires a licensed contractor for jobs costing \$200 or more (including labor and materials) and participants are warned against the many financial risks and workmanship problems posed by nonlicensed contractors.

Visual aids are used to acquaint participants with contractor pocket licenses and Home Improvement Salesperson Registration identification cards. Enlarged 3 x 5' facsimiles of each are displayed and the participants are advised to insist upon seeing the contractors pocket license, to check for a license number, classification and subclassifications, expiration dates, etc. CSLB representatives also advise consumers to verify any information with the board should there be any doubts about the authenticity or status of the license.

Participants are informed about the legal limit governing downpayments, encouraged to obtain more than one written bid, look at the work the contractor has completed for other customers, verify that the contractor has workers compensation insurance coverage, to keep a job file and make frequent inspections of the work and a final walk through.

Consumers are cautioned against acting in the capacity of an owner/builder and urged to insist that the contractor pull building permits. Despite all of the precautions taken, sometimes problems do occur. In that event, we are advising consumers to try to negotiate with the contractor and reach a mutual solution before filing a complaint.

The participants have ample opportunity to ask questions and are given copies of CSLB consumer brochures which recap the seminar in greater detail.

The underlying message that we try to convey is that the contractor has certain responsibilities but the consumer is also responsible for doing their homework by properly planning, selecting a contractor and insuring that all work and any modifications to which the parties agree, are put in a written contract.


Since the program began, the board has sponsored over 100 Operation Outreach seminars. Some seminars have been cosponsored by members of the legislature. The first assemblymember to cosponsor a seminar was Assemblywoman Maxine Waters. She hosted a half day seminar in her district and hopes to sponsor additional seminars. Assemblyman Stan Statham hosted seminars in the early fall. Both received favorable constituent response and media coverage.

AB 2040 provides:


- For an air standard for asbestos of .01 fibers per cc of air in a public school building—rooms that exceed this level cannot be occupied;
- Contractors engaged in asbestos-related work which involves 100 square feet or more, must pass an asbestos certification exam;
- That contractors removing asbestos must contact Cal-OSHA and follow certain safety procedures;
- That Cal-OSHA is to update existing 1976 asbestos safety standards.

AB 2040 was supported by management, labor, school and health organizations.

Bob Berrigan, licensing deputy for the CSLB, projects that applications for this certification, which can be obtained only by

licensed contractors, should be available from the board by mid-January. The certification examination is also expected to be administered by the board in April 1986. There will be a \$50 fee for the certification examination.

In addition to the certification requirement imposed by AB 2040, the board is also directed to prepare an informational pamphlet on asbestos for distribution to all contractors. The industry representatives sought this provision so that all contractors would be informed of the hazards of unregulated asbestos removal, as it affects the public and contractors alike. To ensure that the pamphlet garners the intended attention, the board will also mail an "open-book" examination, based on information in the pamphlet, to all contractors who must compete in the exam. This exam must be signed and returned with the contractors' renewal notices.

LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

HOME IMPROVEMENT CONTRACTS

Assemblyman Pat Johnston carried AB 741 (Chapter 989, Statutes of 1985) which establishes conditions under which a home improvement contract becomes unenforceable against the buyer. The bill was signed by the Governor in 1985.

If obtaining the contract is contingent upon obtaining a loan for all or a portion of the contract price, then the contractor may not perform any services, deliver any property or represent in any manner that the buyer has any obligation under the contract until 1) the third party (making the loan) agrees to make the loan, 2) the buyer accepts the loan, and 3) the buyer does not rescind the loan or financing transaction within the period allowed for rescission. This is true even if the contractor provides financing or assists the buyer in obtaining a loan, including referring a buyer to any person who may loan or arrange a loan for all or a portion of the contract price.

Should the contractor begin work before the above described conditions are satisfied, he or she immediately will have to return all money, property or any other consideration given by the buyer. If property which was given by the buyer cannot be returned, the contractor will be obligated to return the fair market value, or the value of the property as designated in the contract, *whichever is greater*.

The abuses that led to the introduction of this bill may not have been widespread, but did have, collectively, a devastating economic effect on specific segments of the population. A typical home improvement contract with a three-day rescission clause, and contingent upon obtaining third party financing, may have been initiated by the contractor immediately after it was signed. Then, if the financing did not come through, or was available from another source in terms unfavorable to the owner, the contractor put pressure on the owner to accept *any* financing in order to complete the project. And, naturally, the owner, with his or her home torn up, felt compelled to find money anywhere to make the property habitable again. Seeing the vulnerability of these people, Assemblyman Johnston authored AB 741, which should have far-reaching consumer-protection impact.

SERVICING OF FIRE EXTINGUISHING SYSTEMS—SB 631 (Montoya)

Existing law authorizes the State Fire Marshal to license persons who wish to service fire extinguishing systems. The Contractors License Law also provides for licensure of specialty contractors (C-16 classification: Fire Protection Engineering). SB 631, effective January 1, 1986, relieves C-16 contractors of this dual licensing requirement by exempting holders of valid C-16 licenses from the licensing requirement of the State Fire Marshal. This legislation was sponsored by PHCC and supported by the CSLB.

The CSLB sponsored SB 1413, which was carried by Senator Art Torres and signed into law by the Governor, becomes effective on January 1, 1986. Originally, the intention was to clarify existing definitions of the home improvement salesperson registration requirements. As the bill proceeded through the Legislature, an amendment was added, providing that in citation proceedings restitution may be ordered in lieu of ordering correction. Obviously there are situations where restitution is the only sensible resolution, if for example, corrective action had to be taken immediately, and the plaintiff should be compensated by the contractor for that expense. While the CSLB had been seeking restitution, certain administrative law judges believed that existing citation provisions did not specify that restitution could be ordered. Hence the CSLB sought the change to allow the option.



CASH PAYMENTS

Since January 1, 1985, legislation enacted into law gives the CSLB additional disciplinary powers over licensees who pay cash to employees but fail to maintain proper records and refuse to provide those records to authorized CSLB representatives who are conducting a review or audit.

Should the board take disciplinary action against a contractor for violating this law, the licensee may be ordered to pay investigative costs incurred by the CSLB for up to \$2,500 per incident.

This legislation was part of the Tax Amnesty package carried by Assemblyman Hannigan.

CONSUMERS CAN SUE NON-LICENSEES FOR TRIPLE DAMAGES

Governor Deukmejian signed SB 486 by Senator Ed Davis, which will give consumers who are victimized by unlicensed contractors added and strengthened recourse in civil court. Existing law allows a homeowner to sue an unlicensed contractor for actual damages. Effective January 1, 1986, Senator Davis' bill allows plaintiffs to seek triple damages up to \$10,000 and to recoup attorney costs and court fees if they prevail in the legal actions.

The practical effect of this bill is to make it more financially feasible for consumers to sue. Although the statute applies to any unlicensed person who causes injury or damage to another person as a result of providing goods or services for which a license is required, the most significant impact will befall unlicensed contractors.

Senator Davis has received "many complaints from contractors where unscrupulous contractors are stealing business from legitimately licensed contractors." Unfortunately, those "unlicensed contractors are not always apprehended, because prosecutors are overworked," but Senator Davis hopes that "this bill will give prosecutors the impetus to take appropriate action against unlicensed contractors."

SB 223, by Senator John Seymour, signed into law in 1985, requires any public entity, the University of California and the California State University systems to specify in any plans prepared for a public project and in any notice to bid, what classifications of contractors licenses a contractor must possess to be awarded the contract.

According to definitions in the Public Contract Code, "public entity" includes state, counties, cities, districts, public authorities or agencies, municipal corporations and other political subdivisions. Contracts, for purposes of these provisions, refers to contracts exceeding \$25,000 undertaken by the above entities. SB 223 becomes effective on January 1, 1986.

The Difference Between An "A" and "B" License

At last count there were some 10,000 "A" and 95,000 "B" licensed contractors in this state bidding on every kind of project imaginable. One general building contractor submitted a bid to install a 40,000-gallon underground fuel storage tank for the California Highway Patrol. Many "A" contractors have bid on projects to build or remodel buildings. As a result there have been numerous protests to the awarding authorities that the low bidder did not hold the proper license classification to perform the work involved. This has frequently put me on the "hot-seat" to determine the proper classification to perform the project. It has also cost the awarding authorities lots of aggravation and lost time. More importantly, it has cost *YOU* the contractor, lots of money in lost jobs.

DO YOU KNOW THE SCOPE AND LIMITS OF YOUR LICENSE?

Let's pause a moment and take a quiz.

1. Can a "B" contractor bid on a project which includes grading and paving a parking lot? YES NO
2. High-rise buildings are constructed by General Engineering Contractors.
T F
3. General Building Contractors can build food processing plants. T F
4. Can a "B" contractor build a terminal building on an airport? YES NO
How about an "A"? YES NO
5. Can an "A" contractor build a swimming pool? YES NO
How about a "B"? YES NO
6. Which classification is appropriate for building a microwave relay station, including the antenna and equipment buildings? "A" "B" BOTH

Before answering these questions, I'll discuss some general philosophy. At present there are 40 classes of contractors. The "A" and "B" classes are defined by Sections 7056 and 7057 of the California Business and Professions Code. In other words the Legislature defines the limits and scope of general engineering and general building work. The other 38 specialty classifications are defined by Board Rules and Regulations. To my knowledge, there have not been any changes made to the

"A" and "B" classes since they were defined by law about the year 1930. The intent of the Legislature, apparently, was to distinguish contractors who performed "heavy" construction from contractors who constructed buildings.

Essentially, that's where we are today. General engineering contractors can perform almost every type of "heavy" construction except those trades normally associated with constructing a building. An "A" cannot perform roofing, drywall, plumbing, electrical, flooring, plastering, etc., that is associated with constructing a building. Further, an "A" may not act as the prime contractor to construct a building.

Sounds simple, right? Wrong. There are exceptions. For example, an "A" may construct a building on an engineering project such as a park, airport, dam site, shipyard and sewage treatment plants. A "B" contractor may also construct a building on most of these projects, if that is the extent of the project.

Let me cite a frequent scenario: A city wants to add a restroom facility to an existing park that has been there for many years. The project will consist of a conventional building only, with sidewalks and handicap access. Either an "A" or "B" may bid on this project. Confused? Don't be. Let's answer the questions on the quiz to clarify some issues.

Question #1. If you answered yes, but only under certain conditions, you are right on track. As long as there is a building under construction, and the parking lot is adjacent to the building and intended to service that specific building, AND the "B" is the prime contractor for constructing the building, the "B" may construct the parking lot. If the project involved a parking lot only, the proper classification would be an "A" or C-12 for Earthwork and Paving.

Question #2. The answer is false, general building contractors build high-rise buildings.

Question #3. False again. "A" contractors build industrial plants.

Question #4. If you answered yes, you are doing very well. We have already learned that there are certain projects where both classes overlap, if certain conditions are met.

Question #5. I bet I get a lot of you on this one! The answer is yes, with conditions. The "A" can build any swimming pool, anywhere. The "B" may only construct the pool in conjunction with building or remodeling the adjacent building.

Question #6. The answer is—only a general engineering contractor.

Please keep in mind that these are only general guidelines. There are many unique and combined projects where the general rules do not apply.

So, how does all this affect you? In the pocketbook! Don't get caught short. The smart contractor who has varied skills and is bidding on large projects will have both the "A" and "B" licenses. Contractors who work on smaller projects will be aware of the scope of the project and will obtain a joint-venture license with another licensee who holds the proper classification. Remember, the CSLB can issue a joint venture license over the counter in about 30 minutes! This can be accomplished at our Sacramento Headquarters or at any of our regional offices.

Contractor Citations

Section 7090.1 of the Contractors License Law provides that failure to pay a civil penalty or comply with an order of correction once it becomes final shall be grounds for denial of or refusal to renew a license.

Essentially, this means that a licensee who has not complied with a CSLB citation which has become a final order, will not be issued any further licenses until he/she complies with the citation.

Further, licenses will not be renewed until the contractor complies with the citation. It is the responsibility of the contractor to clear up citations with the CSLB regional offices which issues citations. Citations contain the phone number of the appropriate regional office. If you misplaced a citation, call (916) 366-5153 to determine which regional office to contact.

New Exams Developed

Over the last three years, the law and business examination and 35 of the 40 trade examinations (exams for all classes except C-11, 45, 55, 57 and 61) were newly written or revised. (See Table 1). Newer versions of the exams insure that the content is current and test for important information that contractors must know.

Consulting firms have surveyed licensed contractors in the field to identify all the work that a contractor must know to insure that consumers receive competent contracting services. Tests are developed based on the information supplied for this survey. The tests have been pretested, and the CSLB will continue to revise test questions and make periodic modifications, where necessary.

Study guides are available for the exams, which list topics covered in the test, recommended reading material and sample questions. A combined study guide for all exams should be available by early 1986. This single document will be distributed with applications, giving applicants more time to obtain and study suggested reference materials before the exam. JOINT VENTURE LICENSING CHANGES

The law now requires that for an active joint venture to be valid, the licensed entities which make up the joint venture must be actively renewed and in good standing. A joint venture license will be suspended during any period when an entity is suspended, expired or inactive. While the CSLB does not have the computer capability at this time to link the status of joint venture licenses and their entities, a one-time manual check is being made to determine their validity. All joint venture licensees will receive status letters for their licenses with the notice.

Solar Exam/License Changes

The Contractors State License Board completed the development of the C-46 solar contractor examination earlier this year and has been administering the exam for several months.

The C-46 exam consists of questions from 12 knowledge areas including: solar design engineering, solar energy design materials, knowledge of HVAC (Heating/Ventilation/Air Conditioning work), plumbing, electrical, roofing, general construction, applicable codes and other requirements, safety procedures, plans and specifications and mathematics.

A C-46 solar license may not be necessary for contractors licensed in the A, B, C-4, C-10, C-20, C-36 and C-53 classes. These contractors may do solar work which falls within the scope of their license classification(s). However, applicants for licensure who wish to use the word "solar" in their namestyles may continue to use it in their namestyle until January 1, 1987. Thereafter, the word "solar" must be deleted from the namestyle unless the contractor holds a C-46 class license.

Another company sold solar and water purifying systems allegedly telling customers that there were cancer causing agents in the municipal water supply and that the water purifying systems could remove the carcinogens. The board has nearly completed its criminal and administrative investigations into case.

The CSLB is investigating allegations of unlawful business practices and fraudulent sales tactics against Sunar formerly Statewide Solar of Modesto and Lodi.



GOVERNMENT ENTITIES COOPERATE TO BETTER ENFORCE LAWS

The CSLB, the Department of Industrial Relations, the Employment Development Department, the Franchise Tax Board and the Internal Revenue Service have an ongoing cooperative effort entitled the Interagency Contractor Enforcement (ICE) agreement to permit the information gathered by one government entity to be shared among other government agencies to better enforce laws pertaining to the construction industry.

Under the terms of the ICE agreement, these government agencies share and exchange information that is considered public information under the Information Practice Act. In addition, the CSLB will provide home addresses and social security numbers. Other information that will be shared among the agencies includes license status, bond information, lists of licensed and nonlicensed contractors that fail to provide workers' compensation insurance; names of employers cited for paying wages without issuing statements of deductions for taxes; and other information indicating possible violations of the Business and Professions, Labor, Unemployment Insurance, Revenue and Taxation or Internal Revenue Codes.

Although the ICE agreement was signed by all participants on July 1, 1985, this effort has been in effect for several years. This year, the parties involved in the agreement, more clearly defined the specific information (as listed above) that they intended to share. Thus, the agencies have better tailored the program to suit the individual needs of their respective agencies.

Though the program is not viewed as a panacea for the problem, it is expected that the program will put on notice those contractors that fail to pay their fair share of taxes or provide workers compensation insurance or violate other laws that were designed to protect the public.

It's the Law

Relief from Mistaken Bid on Public Work

No portion of the contracting process is riskier to the general contractor than bidding. An unrealistically low bid can threaten the viability of a contractor's business. In some cases, a contractor may be lulled into submitting an unrealistically low bid by representations of the owner, the owner's representatives, or another contractor. May a contractor withdraw his bid and refuse to perform the project, after acceptance of his bid, in such circumstances? The State Court of Appeal has ruled that the contractor may do so, in some instances.

In *Architects and the Contractors Estimating Services v. Smith*, a general contractor named Noble contracted with the United States Navy to remodel the engine maintenance shop at El Toro Marine Corps Air Station. The contract called for installation of a heating, ventilating and air

conditioning system ("HVAC"); a chilled water system was to be part of the HVAC. In preparing its bid, Noble relied on a bid for the HVAC work prepared by Berry, an experienced HVAC subcontractor. Berry bid the work at \$86,500.

Later, Berry discovered his bid was in error. Berry had not realized that the bid was to include installation of a chilled water system as part of the HVAC. Another contractor, which had thoroughly investigated the project, submitted a bid to Noble more than 20 percent higher.

Noble submitted a contract to Berry, which Berry refused to sign. Instead, Berry asked Harold Smith, a less experienced contractor to sign a contract to install the HVAC system for \$86,500. Berry told Smith the project had a 20-percent profit margin. Without making a significant effort to independently investigate the project, Smith signed a contract with Noble to install the HVAC system, including the chilled water system. Only then was Smith told, by an estimator for a competing company, that the cost of the project "far exceeded" the contract price. Smith refused to install the HVAC system, and Noble sued Smith for failure to honor his bid. The trial court held that Smith could avoid the obligation created by the bid, because Noble, the general contractor, knew or should have known that "there was a substantial error" in Smith's bid. The lowest bid Noble had received from anyone else was substantially higher than that submitted by Smith. Noting that California law permits a party to rescind a contract obtained "through fraud or mistake," the court held that Smith was entitled to refuse performance.

Noble argued that there was no valid "mistake," since Smith was very careless in signing a contract to perform HVAC work without personally examining the project. While admitting that "Smith's business acumen was something less than sharp," the court refused to hold Smith to his bargain on this basis. Stating that Smith was "a babe in the woods of commercial air conditioning," the court found that the inducement to sign the contract was a "set up" obtained by Noble's deliberate suppression of the fact that the contract price was intended to include a chilled water system.

This new decision has great significance for general contractors and subcontractors who find themselves misled by material omissions from the information they are given to bid a project. In the past, courts have traditionally turned a deaf ear to contractors' complaints that the information they were given was incomplete. The *Architects and Contractors* case suggests that, in appropriate circumstances, the courts are beginning to view the contractor's plight more sympathetically.

WORK PRESERVATION FUND

In the mid-1970s when construction work declined and workers and contractors found themselves without steady work, leaders from

the International Brotherhood of Painters and Allied Trades and from contractors' associations, joined together to discover ways to increase work opportunities for their companies and their workers.

This joint labor-management group concluded that union contractors lost out on public contracts, worth millions of dollars in construction and repair work, because the work was either not publicly bid or was awarded to lower bidders who were not paying the legally required prevailing wage.

Investigations found that many state and local agencies were performing large volumes of work themselves, in violation of the force account limits established by law. By law, if a project exceeds the force account limits established for a public agency, the project must be bid to private contractors. If these force account limits were enforced, work opportunities would increase for contractors and workers in the private sector. To that end, the joint labor-management group initiated a program to assure that public works projects in excess of force account limits were publicly bid.

This group also concluded that union contractors lost public contracts because they could not compete against low bidders who provided low wages and no benefits to their workers. Low bidders were winning these public works contracts because agencies were not enforcing the laws requiring payment of prevailing wages, overtime and fringe benefits.

To recapture these public contracts, the group developed a program to assure that laws governing public works construction, labor standards, public contracting and licensing requirements were enforced by public agencies. Greater compliance with these laws would mean fair competition and more jobs for union contractors, more work for painters and tapers, and higher quality standards for public agencies contracting construction work.

In 1977, the Painting and Drywall Work Preservation Fund was incorporated as a labor-management venture to increase job opportunities for workers and contractors. The Work Preservation Fund has an administrator that reports to a seven-member board of directors which meets every two months. Board meetings also are attended by six advisors to the board of directors who represent labor and management. An overall committee composed of delegates representing labor and management meets semi-annually to review the program and accomplishments, and future goals of the Work Preservation Fund.

The Work Preservation Fund is headquartered in Oakland and has a Southern California office in Woodland Hills. Each of these offices has staff to investigate public works projects where violations are suspected of force account limits, public contracting laws, contractors' licensing law and prevailing wage requirements.
